3rd International Research Seminar on Risk and the Supply Chain at Business and Management Studies Department, MMU Cheshire, 13th to 15th October 2003

The Department has just concluded hosting the 3rd International Research Seminar on Risk and the Supply Chain. This year saw a widening of the representation with leading Professors in the field from Michigan State University and Cranfield University together with other active researchers from Sweden, Denmark, USA and the UK (MMU, Cranfield and Bristol universities). The annual seminar was established by the Department and is the annual focal point of the ISCRIM research network. Next year's seminar is to be hosted by Michigan State University.

Judging by the interest in the ISCRIM network and the seminar this is a field of study that is capturing the interest and attention of researchers, practitioners and research funding bodies, both Cranfield and Michigan State Universities are engaged in major externally funded projects currently. The seminar provides the opportunity for international colleagues to share progress on research and to exchange ideas and proposed developments. Special thanks are due to Kerri Faulkner who undertook the difficult task of the seminar administration with her usual superb efficiency and effectiveness.

The next significant outcome from the ISCRIM group is the book 'Supply Chain Risk Management: A Reader' commissioned by Ashgate Publishing and edited by Clare Brindley. This project will bring together the work of around 20 international researchers and scholars in the field from seven different countries. The text is being finalised and should be on the bookshelves early in 2004.
